

How to set up a discussion forum

One of the most useful tools in Moodle is the discussion forum. The forum is a key communication tool in Moodle which allows users to post messages and respond to each other's contributions. It is very useful for online tutorials and group projects.

How to set up a forum

First turn course editing on using the button in the top left.

Select 'Forum' from the 'Add an activity or resource pop-up, and click the 'Add' button. The 'Add new forum' page will appear.

All the most important settings are in the 'General' box.

Give the forum a name, this is what will appear in the link on the course page so make sure it describes the purpose of the forum.

The default forum type is 'Standard forum for general use' this will be fine for most applications but feel free to experiment with the other types.

In the 'Forum introduction' give details of the intentions of this particular forum discussion.

The 'Subscription mode' determines whether students get email notifications of new posts to the forum. The default value for this is 'Optional subscription' which means that the students can choose whether or not to get email notifications. This should be the best setting for most instances.

The other settings can safely be left at their default settings most of the time.

Scroll to the bottom of the page and click on 'Save and return to course'

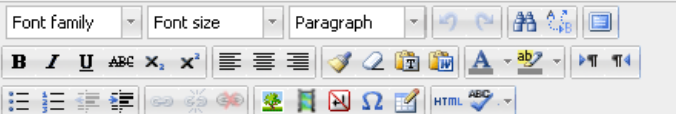
