


Advice to optimize audio quality for your remote music lessons










Also make sure the Show in-meeting option to "Enable Original Sound" from microphone is ticked

Echo Cancellation Auto

Show in-meeting option to "Enable Original Sound" from microphone (9)



In the **Audio Settings** you need to set your **Input Volume** of your microphone



Make sure **Automatically adjust microphone volume** is unticked and set
"Suppress backgroundnoise" is set to **Low**

You'll see the **Input Level Bar**, Play the loudest you would normally in a class and adjust the **Input Volume**, so the level doesn't peak.



Now when you are in a meeting you'll see the **Turn on/off Original Sound button** in the top left

Additional useful information

You can avoid overloading your laptop by standing off-axis, rather than playing directly into the microphone.
